# Sermon 6: Man without God, A Reality Check!

Sunday, March 3, 2013 Romans 1:28-32

#### **Repression** (Of God) I.

**RETAIN** ... **KNOWLEDGE** Echo en epignosis. (an idiom, literally 'to have in recognition') to recognize something as being what it truly is—'to acknowledge.'

#### Reprobation (From God) (Cf., 1 John 4:1; Eph. 5:3) II.

**REPROBATE MIND** Adokimos nous. A mind which is not in line with what is appropriate, fitting.

**NOT CONVENIENT** Katheko. That which is not fitting or right. There is an indication of judgment.

**QUOTE:** This verse is the climax of man's fall from God: they refuse to keep in mind the true knowledge about God. The verb translated refuse to keep in mind basically means to reject something that one has put to the test. There is evidently a play on words in Greek between the verb refuse to keep in mind and the adjective corrupted [NOTE: KJV, reprobate], but this is difficult to carry over in translation. In the present context corrupted refers to a mind that no longer functions as it should; this does not imply insanity, but rather the lack of ability to make moral and spiritual distinctions. **QUOTE:** As they did not like\ did not approve. The Gr. is akin to the Gr. of "reprobate" just below. Knowledge of God met with no approbation, and He gave them over to reprobation. H.G.C. Moule, Romans

#### III. Revelation (Of Man Apart from God)

#### WORDS ASSOCIATED WITH "BEING FILLED WITH"

**FILLED** - *plero-o* To fill up so that there is room for nothing more.

- 1. **UNRIGHTEOUSNESS** (*adikia*) To do wrong, commit injustice.
- 2. **FORNICATION**\* (*porneia*) the general word for sexual sin.
- 3. **COVETOUSNESS** (*pleonexia*) greediness, insatiableness.
- 4. **MALICIOUSNESS** (*kakia*) a mean-spirited attitude of ill will to others.

#### WORDS ASSOCIATED WITH "FULL OF"

- 5. **ENVY** (*phthonou*) a dislike of others based on some perceived advantage the person has over you.
- 6. **MURDER** (*phonou*) intentional killing.
- 7. **DEBATE** (*eridos*) strife, the expression of different opinions with antagonism or hostility.
- 8. **DECEIT** (*dolou*) deception by trickery and falsehood.
- 9. **MALIGNITY** (*kako-etheias*) a defect of character that leads on to be hurtful to others. Mean-spirited.

# THIRTEEN WORDS THAT MODIFY THE WORD "THEM" IN "GAVE THEM OVER"

- 10. WHISPERERS (psithyristas) gossips.
- 11. BACKBITERS (katalaous) slanderers.
- 12. **HATERS OF GOD** (theostygeis)
- 13. **DESPITEFUL** (*hybristas*) rude, insulting, disrespectful.
- 14. **PROUD** (*hyperephanous*) arrogant, ostentatiously proud.
- 15. BOASTERS (alazonas) braggarts.
- 16. **INVENTORS OF EVIL THINGS** (*epheuretas kakon*) One who thinks up schemes or plans for evil.
- 17. **DISOBEDIENT TO PARENTS** (*goneusin apeitheis*) habitually disobedient or rebellious to parents.
- 18. **WITHOUT UNDERSTANDING** (*asynetous*) Foolish, senseless. Lacking the capacity for insight.
- 19. **COVENANT BREAKERS** (*asynthetous*) One not willing to be bound by an agreement or one who breaks such an agreement.
- 20. **WITHOUT NATURAL AFFECTION** (*astorgous*) Hardharted, unfeeling, without love.
- 21. **IMPLACABLE\*** (aspondos) irreconcilable. One unwilling to negotiate a solution to a problem.
- 22. **UNMERCIFUL** (anele-emonas) cruel, refusing to be merciful.

**QUOTE:** It is not simply that man has done these things. God is revealing that man IS these things!

### IV. Recognition (Of God's judgment and penalty)

**QUOTE:** It is remarkable, despite their rejection of the true God and the darkening of their understanding (vv. 21–23), that they are still keenly aware of God's disapproval of their behavior. In fact, their awareness is even greater than this. They know "the ordinance of God" (τὸ δικαίωμα τοῦ θεοῦ, to dikaiōma tou theou), which is specified in the subsequent ὅτι (hoti, that) clause. God's ordinance is that those who indulge in such behavior are "worthy of death" (ἄξιοι θανάτου, axioi thanatou). It follows, then, that Gentiles, without specifically having the Mosaic law, are aware of the moral requirements contained in that law (cf. Thielman 1994a: 169; Wilckens 1978: 115). They not only know that God disapproves of their behavior but they also know that it deserves the punishment of death (cf. 6:23). Nonetheless, they continue to engage in such wicked behavior. ## V. Rebellion (Against God)

- A. Their Actions Worthy of Judgment
- B. Their Approval Worthy of Judgment
  HAVE PLEASURE syneudokeō To join with others in thinking well of something.
  - And men delight in the sins of others as a "sedative" against their own sin.
  - God says that this will bring his judgment just the same as if they had participated!

#### **CONCLUSION (Romans 1:20)**

**QUOTE:** Yes, God is love. But God is also a God of wrath. The terrible sin of men will always evoke a response of wrath from a holy and righteous God. This Scripture is both a warning and a comfort to the believer. If you believe, truly trust in Christ, you can take comfort in the fact that you are covered and protected by the blood of Christ, that you are saved from the wrath of God. But the warning should drive every believer to pray for the unrepentant sinner. Unless the sinner repents, turns away from his sin, he will be lost forever. He will face God's terrible wrath. How does God reveal and execute His wrath upon man? *T.O.S.B.*
